Bernard Coffindaffer made his fortune in a coal-washing business in his home state of West Virginia. At the age of 42, he gave his life to Christ. After undergoing two heart by-pass surgeries and liquidating his business, Coffindaffer received an apparent vision from God. For the final nine years of his life, beginning in the fall of 1984, he spent \$3 million erecting large wooden crosses across 29 states, the District of Columbia, and in the countries of Zambia and the Philippines (he also became a United Methodist pastor during this time). A site owner would donate the land, but Coffindaffer would pick up the entire cost of erecting the cluster of three crosses – a large gold one in the middle and two smaller blue ones on each side. After a brief consecration service, he'd move on to plant others elsewhere. At his death in 1993, Rev. Coffindaffer had erected 1,864 sets of crosses. Perhaps you've seen some of them; there are a number of his crosses scattered throughout Kentucky. The sites continue to need maintenance, and donations are gladly accepted. Coffindaffer felt his crosses would serve as silent witnesses when folks aren't willing to hear human words. He placed them all over the country and beyond to remind everyone, saints and sinners alike, that Jesus was crucified on a cross for our sins, and will one day return. It

But He didn't; He was faithful to the end and fulfilled the vision God had set before Him.

What about us? Do you and I have a consuming passion to pick up our cross and follow after Christ every day? Have we gotten anything close to a vision from God for our lives, and will that vision sustain us through the many temptations we'll face to only go half the way, to give up when the going gets tough? Are we willing, as St. Francis of Assisi urged, to preach the gospel, using words only if absolutely necessary? If Jesus really did die on the cross to forgive our sins and really is coming back one day, the very least we ought to offer up in response is our passionate, all-consuming best.

The registration deadline for the Sand and Summit Women's Retreat is April 24.

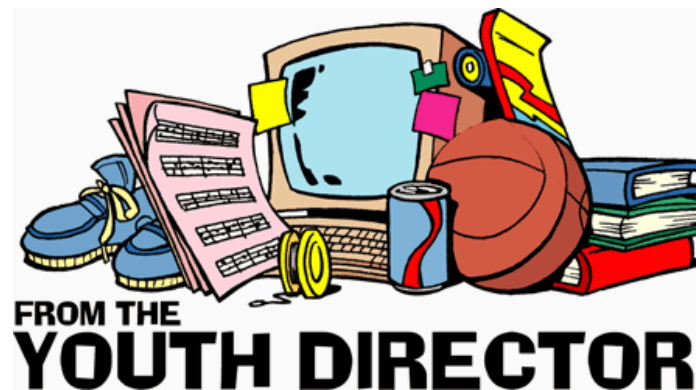
