



FROM THE PASTOR

I remember when the Internet first became real for me. I'd been reading about it for a year or so, somewhere around 1995, but I went to a continuing education event in Lexington where the facilitator pulled up a couple of web sites on the overhead screen. It was very exciting, at least to me, and I even remember the two sites. Now, of course, the Internet isn't really 'new' to very many folks at all. It's become another tool for us to use, albeit a very handy tool. It's the phone book, the post office, the mail-order catalog, the photo album, the checkbook register, the typewriter, the local library and several other things all wrapped up into one.

One of the things that has fascinated me is to watch how some things about the Internet have evolved and survived, while others have not. When I first got on, one could choose either Internet Explorer or Netscape as a browser; now Netscape is no more, but there are many other alternatives to IE. In the 1990s, most household computers operated at

a top speed of 56k; that is now no longer the case. Then, AOL was huge; now, not so much. And there was a time when I'd have bet that MySpace, with all its graphics-rich freedom and individuality, would eventually trounce Facebook, a glorified electronic college campus directory that got bigger than its campus...but it didn't.

All of that is interesting, but as a former English major, I really find it fascinating when a noun becomes a verb. The Google web site has dominated the search engine world for a while now, so much so that we now think nothing of telling someone in search of information: "You should google it." Similar to how we now "parent our children" or "dialogue with others."

And I think about this phenomenon with the word "church." What if "church" were a verb? Not as it has been used to kick someone out of church, but to do church. What if "to church" came to mean "to love" or "to forgive" or "to lift up" or "to offer a second chance?" I'm not sure what the full implications of such a grammatical shift would mean, but I'd like to explore it further...maybe parent the idea as we dialogue together. Surely it's possible; let's google it...

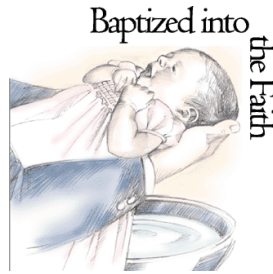
