For example, by purchasing an extended warranty with a new automobile, I've expressed my desire that the car run trouble-free. What I've actually done, though, is place a financial bet that it will likely break down and require a substantial amount of repair work, while the dealership selling me the warranty is gambling that it won't. The same principle applies when we bet against ourselves in regards to insurance. My health premiums demonstrate my hunch I'll become sick, while my policy carrier assumes I'll want to take care of myself and therefore not need to file a claim.

Whenever a new traffic light is installed at an intersection, the intent when it turns yellow is for the approaching line of cars to slow down, right? But what actually happens is just the opposite – they speed up, trying to all squeeze through before the light turns red! To never go see the doctor so he won't have the chance to diagnose some dread disease within us is to actually give a potential malady time and opportunity to gain a foothold. We learn early on in elementary school the way to make little boys or girls like us is to actually act as if we want nothing to do with them. They'll be so intrigued by our ambivalence

and devil-may-care attitude that we become irresistible to them. I think you get the idea.

In Romans 7:19, Paul writes, "I do not accomplish the good I desire, and I commit the very evil I want to avoid." I suppose each and every one of us might be able to write the same thing on any given day. Why? Because we have distorted the image of God in which we were originally created by our universal bent to sinning. We want to, but cannot, save ourselves. The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak.

Is there a remedy for humanity's seemingly hopeless situation? Yes, but it is counterintuitive – not at all what we'd humanly expect. To be found, we must acknowledge we are lost. To win, we must admit we are defeated without Christ. To be innocent in the eyes of God, we must confess our guilt. To be great, we must be counted among the unimportant. To be first, we must accept last place. To please the King, we must serve the least in the kingdom. Strange, I know, but true– so true!

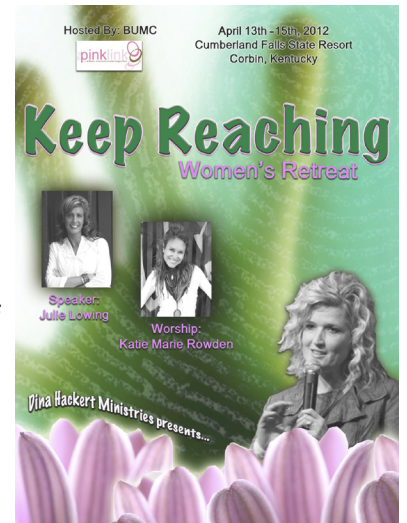
