



FROM THE PASTOR

“Minutiae” is a word that refers to the minor details, the fine print, the exact particulars of life. There are those whose gifts lie in the area of minutiae and for whom no detail is too small. I am not one of them. Like many, I’m more interested in achieving a goal than spending a lot of time poring over the means involved to get there. Some people want to know exactly how a car engine works and what are the specific capacities and measurements under its hood. I like to go places in my car, and as long as it’s running well, I don’t want or need to know much else. It’s important to have both these types of people in life, I suppose, and within the body of Christ.

Someone once asked Jesus if He could condense down all of God’s commandments into a single understandable nugget. He did so by responding, “Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and your neighbor as yourself” (Mark 12:30). No minutiae given, no details presented. Just the basic meat of the matter: Love God, others, and yourself with everything you’ve got. I’m reminded of the modern-day comedian, Larry the Cable Guy, who coined the phrase “Git-R-Done!” in response to our natural tendency to put off doing a job until we have received all the facts, explored all the options, and debated all the reasons why the job can’t (or shouldn’t) be done.

For some, the small book of James is a key part of the Bible. Others haven’t always felt that way. The great German reformer Martin Luther is one example. His theology was intricate and precise – based in large part on this passage from Paul: “For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast” (Ephesians 2:8-9). Luther might have said it this way: “All your good deeds

don’t matter in comparison to whether or not you have faith.” He preferred James not even be included in the Bible, calling it “an epistle of straw.” Why? Because James includes these passages: “Be doers of the word and not just hearers” (James 1:22) and “Faith without works is dead” (James 2:26).

James was apparently a “Git-R-Done” kind of guy, one not so interested in trifling minutiae. I think James simply wanted to see the Lord glorified by our tangible actions. True, James’ epistle is more general than specific, talking more about “God” than “Jesus Christ.” True, James advises us to “Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you” (James 4:8a) when technically, God through His prevenient grace first draws near to us and then we respond to that grace and draw near to Him. And true, he urges the sinners to wash their hands and the double-minded to purify their minds (James 4:8b) when technically, it is Christ who already washed and purified us at the cross. And yet I think James was seeking what the fellow who asked Christ to boil it all down to brass tacks was seeking – what I and others are seeking – to simply see the work of Lord get done!

Cardboard Village – On June 3 and 4, our students will partner with the Meade County Catholic Youth and will live as if they are homeless for 24 hours. They will have to build shelter out of cardboard boxes and will be judged on several categories. They will not be allowed to bring any electronic devices and will only be able to eat what we provide for them. Each participant is required to bring either \$10 or five non-perishable food items to be donated to a local food bank. Our hope is that this event will raise awareness for the homeless among our youth. God calls us not to just accept those who are less fortunate, but to provide for them as well.

Baccalaureate Service – I hope you'll join us as we recognize four of our graduating seniors in both worship services on Sunday, June 5, at Brandenburg UMC. This is a very special time in their lives, and I hope our church family shows up in large numbers to honor their achievement! The following seniors will participate: Scott King, Kelsey Adams, Scarlett Powers and Savannah Buckey. Seniors who are also graduating but will not be present are Samantha Slinger, Kristen Lusk, Avery Sydnor and Ashley Sydnor. Please let these seniors know how much you love and support them as they take such an important step in their lives.

Summer Discipleship Class – I have decided to start a summer class for our senior high youth. I don't anticipate large numbers for this class because I'm going to ask for those who participate to be committed to the group until we finish. We will use "The Christian Atheist" as our material and will cover a chapter a week until we are finished. We will not finish the material this summer due to the number of chapters, but will continue into the fall if needed. This book talks about Christians who believe in God, but live like he doesn't exist. I hope to begin this class by the middle of June and we will likely meet off site.

MFuge! I can't believe it's almost here again, but we're headed back to Nashville and Belmont University for MFuge 2011. Last year we took 14 of our students to Nashville for a week of spiritual growth and service. There will be an MFuge meeting Sunday, June 5, at 6 p.m., for the youth and their parents. This year, we're taking 25 (pray for me) students along with 5 chaperones! This is a powerful week for all of us as we will be the hands and feet of Christ. Even if you aren't a prayer partner, please begin praying for our youth and chaperones!

MFuge Prayer Partner Service – Many of you have signed up to be prayer partners for our youth as we prepare for our week at MFuge. We will have a combination send off/prayer partner service on Sunday, June 26, at 6 p.m. You do not have to be a prayer partner to attend this service, so I hope many of you will attend and send our youth off bathed in prayer.

Summer Schedule – We will no longer meet on Wednesday nights (on a regular basis) until Halftime starts back in the fall. We will continue to meet on Sunday nights, and I'm currently working on a schedule I hope to have completed by the time this newsletter hits your mailbox. Last year we met at my house on Sunday nights and we'll do that some this summer, but I would also like to encourage our church family to host our youth one Sunday night this summer at your home. Think I'm crazy? Of course you do, but here's what I'm thinking. Doing this allows our students to get to know more of you and for you to get to know them. It also changes the environment for our students and prevents us from falling into a "summer rut." Finally, it keeps me out of the doghouse with Alison! Look for a sign-up sheet on the youth bulletin board at church and please consider sponsoring us one night this summer.

Finally, please watch for announcements on our upcoming fundraisers. We will release more info as our planning moves forward, but taking this many students to MFuge will wipe out our budget. Our fundraisers will be very important to the activities we will plan for the rest of the year. If you would like to make a flat donation, we could certainly use it!

Thanks again for all you do to support our youth program.

**2011 Kentucky Conference
Mission Offering
for Church Planters in
Thailand and Venezuela**

Our Communion Offering for June is the Mission Offering for the 2011 Annual Conference. The following excerpt of a letter from Bishop Lindsey Davis gives an overview of this year's Mission Offering:

Our mission offering this year will go to plant a new church in Thailand and to support the education and development of new church planters in the country of Venezuela. Both of these nations have young, emerging Methodist churches. Our efforts in Thailand are through Kentucky Conference leaders Mike and Sherri Morrissey. The work in Venezuela is in cooperation with the United Methodist Church of Venezuela and their Bishop, Juvenal Perez.

In Thailand we will be actually providing support for the development of a specific congregation, helping to fund the pastor's salary.

In Venezuela we will be cooperating with the Seminary of the Methodist Church in Venezuela in helping to prepare their young clergy to be church planters. Over the past five years, over 50 new churches have been planted in Venezuela. As you may know from reading about this nation, the Christian witness is strong even in the midst of some difficulty and persecution.

Our cabinet has set a goal of raising \$120,000 for our mission offering this year. It will be divided equally between the efforts in Thailand and Venezuela.

I am confident in your generous spirit. Last year we gave a record breaking \$240,000 to support the ministry of Red Bird. I am confident that we can have another wonderful response from our people with your help.

We will receive our Communion Offering on Sunday, June 5. The mission offering from Brandenburg UMC will be presented during the Mission and Ministry Celebration on the evening of Friday, June 10 during the 2011 Annual Conference.

The time is approaching for our mission trip to Honduras. **We are in need of vitamins, ibuprofen and acetaminophen for both adults and children.** Your support is important to help us assist the many families in need in Honduras. 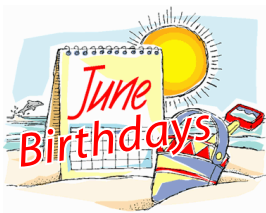
